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Conversation practice: What am I good at?

Work together in groups of three or four people.

Start by reading the full description of the task. Then talk with the rest of the group and find out what you are supposed to do. Only use English during the task. If it is absolutely necessary, you can use Danish or another language.

The task:

1. Find something you are good at and write it at the top of a piece of A4 paper.
You decide what to write, but it should be something you want to tell the rest of the group a little about.
It can be a concrete, everyday thing or it can be something bigger, e.g. "I am good at playing handball" or "I am good at listening to others".
When you're done, pass your paper to the person on your right.
2. You will now receive the paper from the person on your left, and it will say what that person is good at (e.g. "I am good at cooking").
Now, write three questions related to that statement (e.g. "How did you learn to cook?") and then pass the paper on to the person on your right.
3. At the same time, you will get a piece of paper from the person on your left. The paper will have a statement and three questions. Read the statement and the three questions. Write three more questions – and then pass the paper to your right again. In this way, there will be nine questions for each statement if you are a group of four. (Or six questions if you are a group of three).
4. Once you get your own statement back, read all the questions and prepare a short presentation for your group based on those questions. You are welcome to look up words or to ask the rest of your group or your teacher for help while you prepare your presentation.
5. Then you each do your presentation in the group. If you want to, you can let the others ask follow-up questions based on the presentation, so you can have a short conversation about the topic. Try to only speak English during the presentations.
